<u>SOLID WASTE AUTHORITY – BOARD APPOINTMENT</u> – The Commission received a letter from Howard Coffield, Director, Marshall County Solid Waste Authority, recommending the appointment of Charles W. Dobbs to the Solid Waste Authority Board.

On motion of Commissioner Miller, seconded by Commissioner Varner, the Commission approved the recommendation of Howard Coffield, to appoint Charles W. Dobbs to the Solid Waste Authority Board of Directors. Motion carried.

SANFORD CENTER – Al Hendershot, Board member, and Della Deskins, Chairman of the Board, appeared before the Commission. Mr. Hendershot thanked the Commission for support in the past and asked for continued support. The Sanford Center offers a community room and gymnasium for rent at reasonable costs, youth programs, senior services and office space for lease. Mr. Hendershot stated in recognition of continued support, the Board would like to dedicate a community room in honor of the Commission. The Commission would prefer no individual names on the plaque.

On motion of Commissioner Miller, seconded by Commissioner Varner, the Commission authorized Betsy Frohnapfel, County Administrator to work with Mr. Hendershot to design a Commission plaque. Motion carried.

Equipment and Towing, and Carl Boso of Boso Towing, appeared before the Commission with complaints about heavy duty wrecker calls. Also present were Larry Newell, E-911 Director and Sheriff Kevin Cecil. Mr. Berghoff stated he believes the heavy towing rotation schedule is not being followed. The heavy duty towing policy adopted in January 2016, only comes into effect if the owner or officer on site does not have a preference as to what towing company is called. Commissioner Stewart stated the schedule will be re-distributed to E-911, the Sheriff's Department, and all County Fire Departments and all involved personnel will be made aware of this heavy towing schedule. Every effort will be made to make sure the schedule is followed.

<u>uppate on west virginia flood</u> – Mike Mucheck, Assistant OEM Director, appeared to give an update on the floods in West Virginia, June 23, 2016. Mr. Mucheck stated there are twenty four confirmed fatalities. Cleanup and rescue/recovery efforts are ongoing. Damages are still being assessed. Work is continuing on the roads and power outages. OEM deployed Search & Rescue Coordinator Tracy White and her K-9. Appalachian Outreach is accepting donations.

EXECUTIVE SESSION – On Motion of Commissioner Miller, seconded by Commissioner Varner, the Commission went into an executive session requested by Kevin Cecil, Sheriff, on a personnel matter. Commission reconvened.
